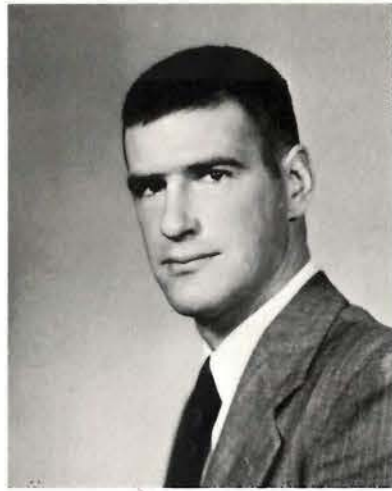

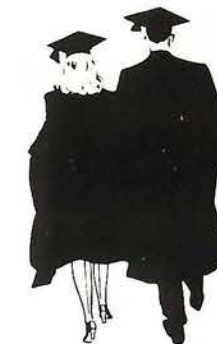

## *PRESIDENT'S CONVOCATION*



Faneuil Hall, renowned as the "Cradle of Liberty," and one of Boston's most interesting historical buildings, had the added distinction of being the site of this year's Convocation ceremony.

The Old South Meeting House, erected in 1729. The Boston Tea Party was planned here.



The Old State House, the oldest state building in America, saw at first hand the birth of the Revolution. In 1776, the Declaration of Independence was read from the balcony to cheering crowds in the streets below.



King's Chapel, founded in 1686, was the first Episcopal Church in New England, and later became the first Unitarian Church in U.S.





The "Old North Church" was erected in 1723. It was here, on April 18, 1775, that "The signal lanterns of Paul Revere warned the country of the march of the British troops to Lexington and Concord."

The U.S.S. Constitution, fondly known as "Old Ironsides," was launched in 1797. It took part in 40 engagements without defeat.



The Park Street Church was built beside the Boston Common in 1809. Here William Lloyd Garrison gave his first anti-slavery address. The site was known as "Brimstone Corner" because brimstone for gunpowder was stored in the cellar during the war of 1812.

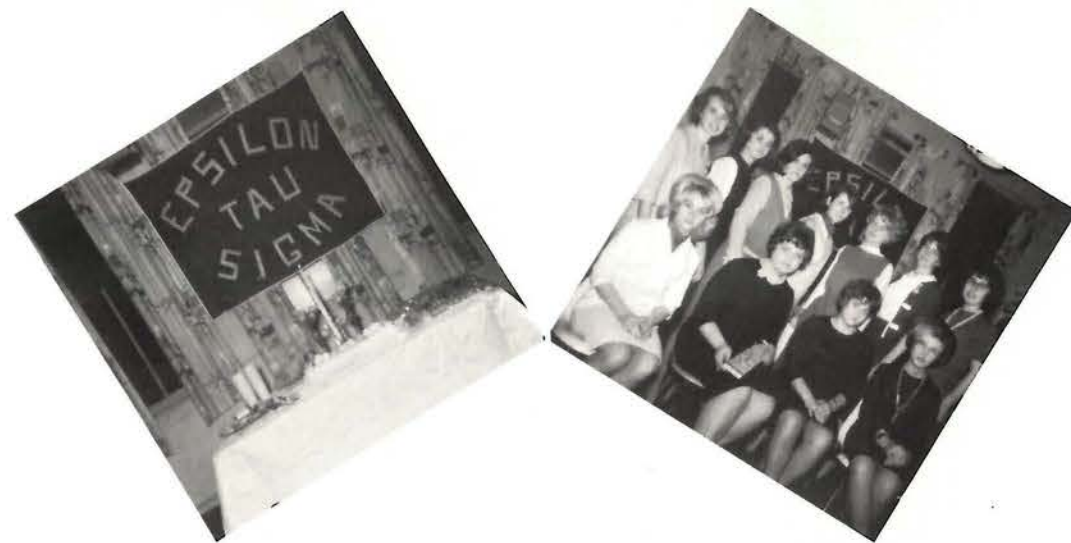

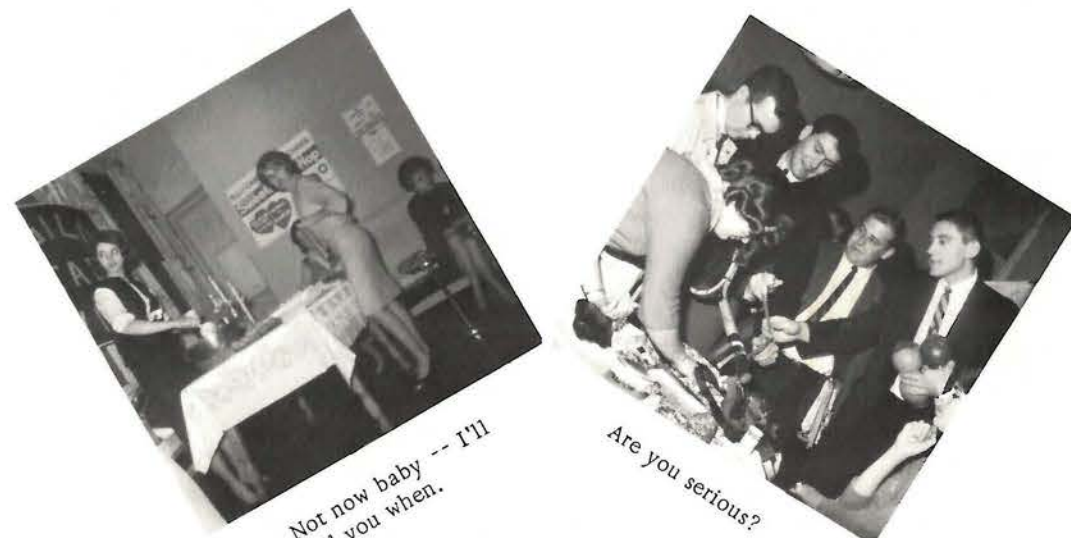
