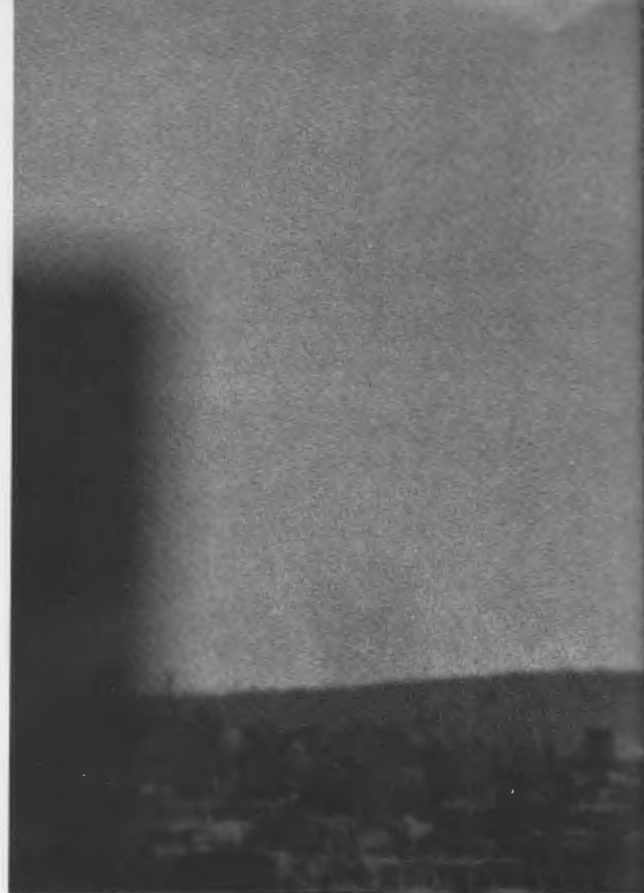

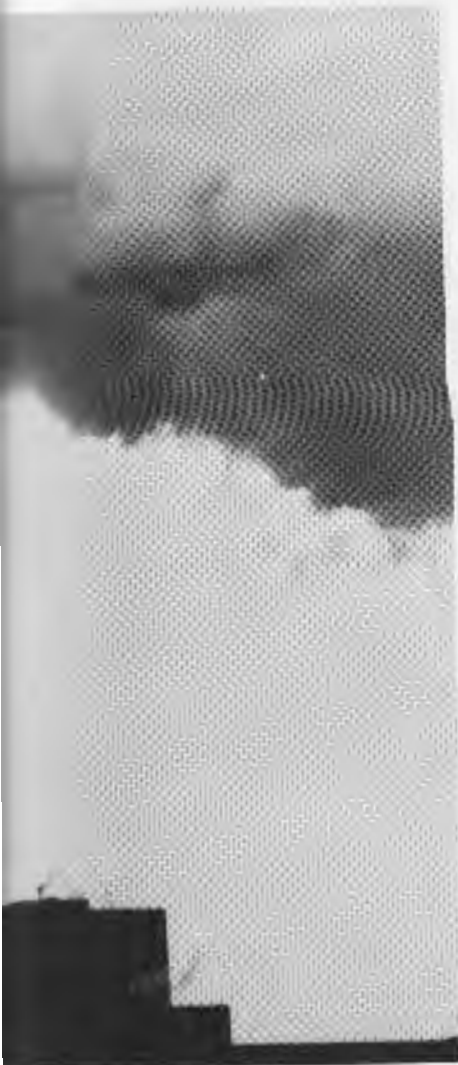

THE CITY WE LIVE IN









There is no such thing as an atmosphere without any pollution. However, it is obvious that certain kinds of air pollution already have reached perilous levels. Radioactivity and pesticides are pollutants representing an insidious kind of destruction that may turn the earth into a poison as these pollutants enter the food chain that man taps for his nourishment.

Boston is doing its share in this world-wide, anti-pollution movement by supplying the city, in several locations with air quality monitoring stations; this is made possible through the Bureau of Air Useage and the State Department of Public Health Management. The primary function of these stations is to locate sources of pollution in the city and record the various levels of the respective pollution. The air quality monitoring stations also evaluate new forms of anti-pollution instruments that are introduced to the city for use. More of these air quality monitoring stations are being implemented by the state.

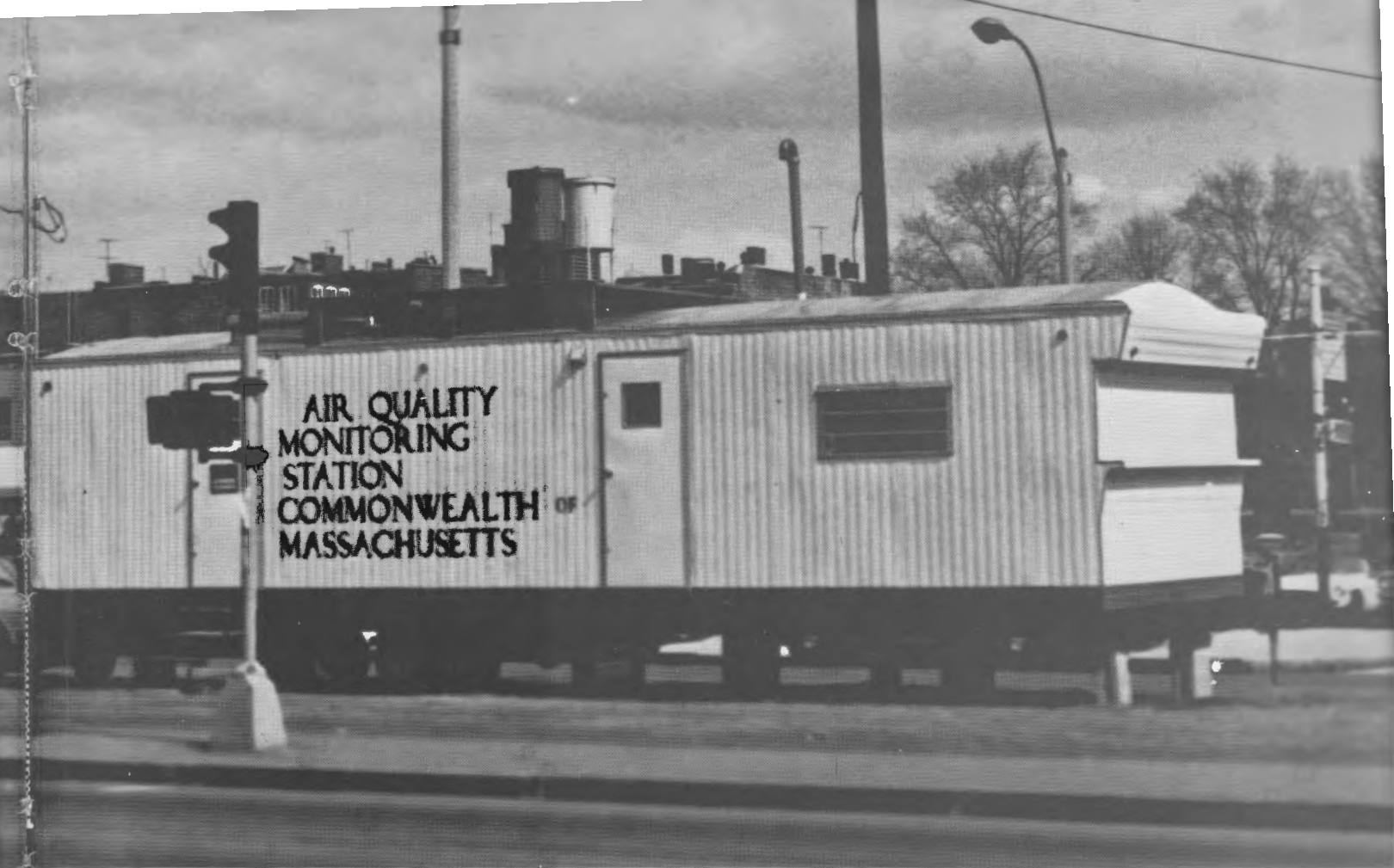
Immediate action to rid America of the massive pollution from five of the most heavily used products of our affluent age should be instituted immediately. The five areas are: internal combustion engine, hard pesticides, detergent pollution, aircraft pollution, and nonreturnable containers. Obviously, pollution must be reduced. Every person has the inalienable right to a desirable environment. The United States and every state shall guarantee this right!

OUR ECOLOGICAL CRISIS.

If you were asked to give a practical definition of the word ecology, how would you define it? The word ecology is extended to mean the study of "dwelling places" in the longest possible sense: the whole environment that surrounds man and all other biological organisms. The breadth of the appeal of our theme, ecology, for the 1971 LION, depends first of all on its timeliness, for there is no subject that has received or is likely to receive more widespread attention throughout the 1970's than the problem of man's destruction of his living environment and the threat it constitutes to human survival. Nor is there a subject for which youth, in particular, has shown a greater universal interest.

There is no such thing as an atmosphere without any pollution. Pollution must be reduced, but we are not dealing in absolutes. We must know what levels are tolerable, and we must know the conveniences or desires that must be sacrificed to maintain these levels. New mass transit systems may be required. Individual desires to own several automobiles will have to be curtailed. And this is but the beginning. Ecologists tell us we shall have to mount a revolution of declining expectations. Gadgets will have to go. Creature comforts. We shall have to find out exactly what life in a megalopolis really costs, and whether or not we are getting our money's worth. Simple freeway tariff schedules could alter traffic patterns immediately by penalizing overpowered and under-occupied vehicles.

To most people, air and space are synonymous; both seem to be available in unlimited amounts to please mankind. Our generation has discovered that unfortunately nothing on earth is unlimited, and we have begun to worry about the limitation of our soil, our water, and lately our air. Some of us feel that our generation has a responsibility to future ones in using these resources wisely. It is clear now that we cannot any longer use the air indiscriminately as a dumping ground for all our by-products, especially when ventilation is inadequate.

At present it is neither our lack of engineering know-how which is holding up the control of air pollution in this country, nor is it that we are too poor to afford the money which is needed for these controls. The difficulties are inherent in government of people; we have to convey to a sufficiently large number of citizens that air pollution is bad from the point of view of health, and costly from a purely economic point of view, and that it does interfere with the proper enjoyment of life in general. The hundreds of autonomous, largely self-serving structures which make up our large urban developments need to work together wholeheartedly among themselves and with state and federal authorities to master the insidious contaminations of the air.

This is one of the most difficult messages I have ever attempted to write, not only because it is the last message I shall be called upon to write as President of Graham Junior College, but also because your theme – Ecology and Pollution – is so basic to my thinking as an educator and a person.

I know you learned something about ecology while you were here, something you will apply to the environment in which you will spend your future. If you will try to make your neighborhood an oasis of beauty, wherever you go, your neighborhood will be a better place to live in because you are there.

My concern embraces much more than our physical environment. Important as is this environment in order to live, even more important is the inner, the spiritual ecology, which makes life worth living.

Although we cannot survive without breatheable air and potable water, there is little point to survival if all we have is merely breatheable air and potable water. This is the educational objective to which Graham is committed. In order to make our lives meaningful and worthwhile, we must personally involve ourselves in the community and in all aspects of community life. Only then can we apply our know-how to the successful solution of our mutual problems.

This philosophy which I hope you will take with you into the world will enable you to enrich and beautify your environment, both inner and outer.

OUR PRESIDENT RESIGNS

November 19, 1970

Perhaps no time will ever be the right time to announce my resignation, yet the announcement must be made. All members of our college community are entitled to know that I wish to resign and why.

In education, 20 years is practically a lifetime. The last 20 years encompassed more history, more change, more violence, more uncertainty than any comparable vicennial since the beginning of time.

During this period we have had five presidents of the United States, we have been involved in two costly wars, and we have walked on the moon. We solved the problems of space while our ghettos burned, and our spaceship – Earth – hurtled toward ecological disaster.

During these 20 turbulent years, I have presided over an institution that grew from nine students to 1250 students, from three rented rooms in a downtown office building to four college-owned facilities, from a secretarial school to one of the outstanding private junior colleges in the United States.

I believe that no president of an educational institution should serve for more than 20 years, and I have served my time. It is time for change. Orderly change is healthy; fresh points of view are needed; new solutions are desirable.

On May 7, 1970, I read the following statement to the Board of Trustees: "I have been considering the matter of my resignation for a long time. I have mentioned it informally to various Trustees, and I am sure that it does not come to you as a complete surprise."

"June 1971 for me will mark the completion of 20 years as president of this institution. While the institution has grown and changed, and each day has brought new problems and fresh challenges, and I love College dearly, I feel that the time for new and younger leadership has come."

"It is with the deepest regret that I tender my resignation, effective June 1971."

The Trustees accepted my resignation, but recommended a delay in announcing it until a Search Committee could be organized. Such a committee has been appointed and is about to begin the search for a new president. The committee has asked me to inform members of the college community that it will welcome their suggestions.

Incidentally, June 1971 will mark the 21st Anniversary of the College. The College will have come of age. I am sure it will continue to grow in excellence and prestige. It will always occupy a special place in my heart.

And I would like to thank all the members of the college community for making my tenure here so pleasant and rewarding. Without them the College could never have come this far – with them its future is assured.

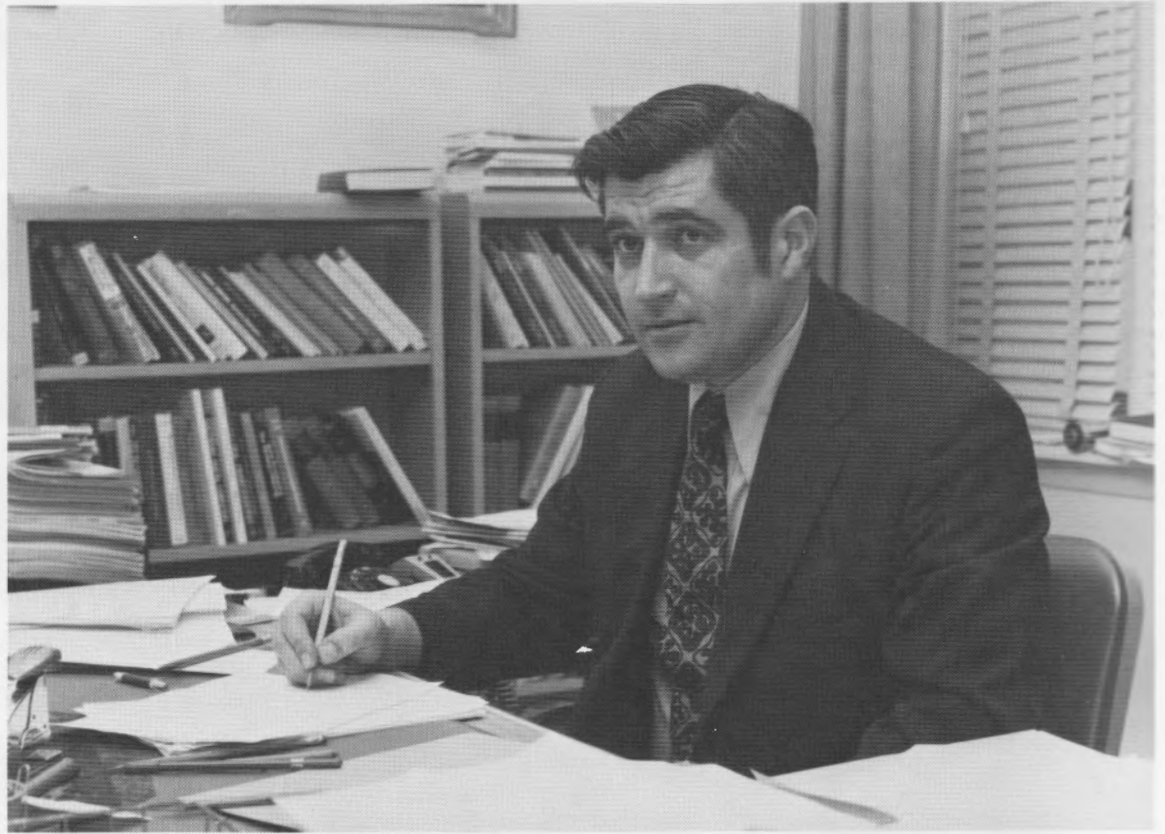

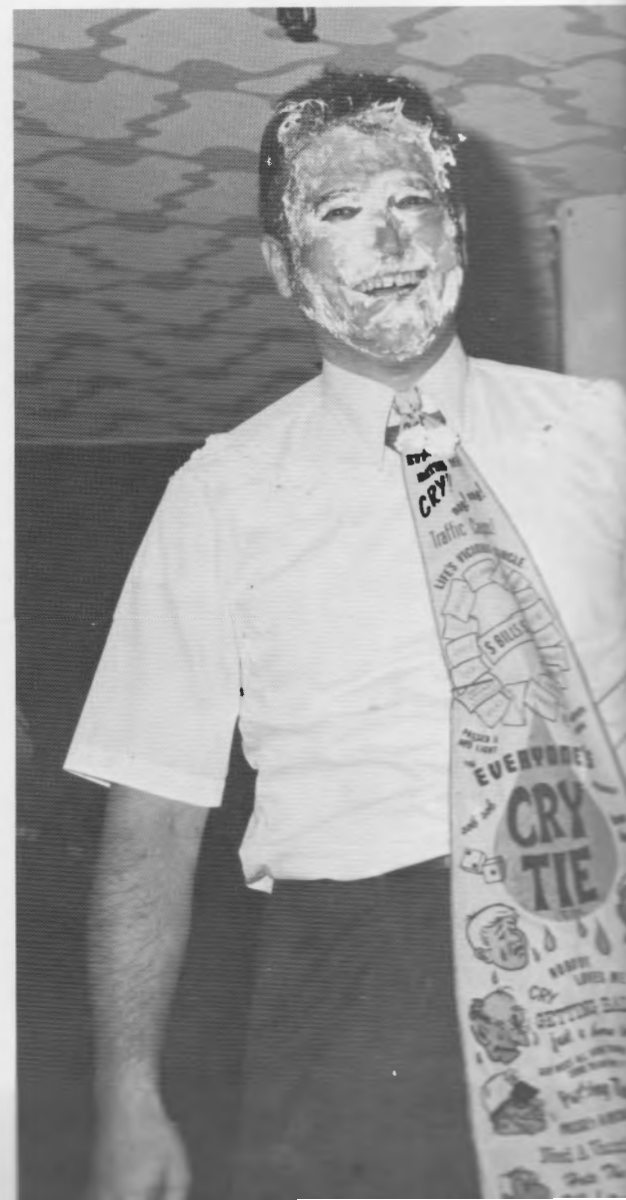

The very serious science of ecology has evolved from the less serious but interesting hobby of conservation. This indicates that man once again recognizes that he is at odds with his environment.

Man possesses a tremendous capacity for development as demonstrated by his sense of creativity and inventiveness. Regardless of all his brilliance in these areas, man has never mastered the means of harnessing and coordinating his creativity and inventiveness in the service of his long-range interests. The environmental threats to our existence today take different forms than they did 2000 years ago. Today environmental dangers are being caused primarily by our own mismanagement of the earth's resources and until recently, our lack of awareness of the problem.

Man must develop a sensitivity to the unity of all life, a pride in the quality of his technology and his ability to integrate its fruits in his best interests, and a determination to keep this planet inhabitable and productive. Until these developments are brought about, the science of ecology will want for a sense of purpose, a philosophy.

A philosophy of ecology, important though it is, will not be sufficient to attack our serious environmental problems without the development of the necessary structures. We must place great emphasis on developing a coordinated structure of governmental, political and private institutions on an international basis to deal with environmental problems.

On a positive note, there have been some recent political developments that indicate that we are beginning to respond on a national level to programs and projects that affect the physical conditions of our existence. Let us hope that our future efforts in this matter are successful.
