A LETTER FROM THE EDITORS

The academic year 1974-1975, brought numerous changes to the Grahm Junior College Community. Internship for Communications Students was coordinated by Karen Ungerleider, the Director of Cooperative Education and Placement, and has thus far proved to be very effective as a learning method. This year the Baseball Team coached by Jack Eydenberg, grabbed first place with a record of seven wins and one loss. WINR-TV saw the return of "The Barry Awards," while WCSB-Radio witnessed the start of its renovation. And the Asst. Dean of Communications, George Schwartz is still quoted as saying, "There are no jobs in the industry." But then some things never change.

As Grahm was changing, so was the world in which we live. World attention was riveted on the rising tension of the Arab-Israeli borders while Boston felt the tensions of School Bussing in Roxbury and South Boston. Unemployment reached its highest percentage in thirty years, and in an attempt to sell those cars on the lots, Detroit introduced the "Rebate." Saigon fell in the late part of April and within three days, Americans adopted over 60,000 orphans. And finally on April 19, 1975, at Six in the Morning, the cannons on the Concord Green were fired commemorating the 200 years since our first battle for independence.

What we have attempted to accomplish with the LION is to capture the many moods and changes which occurred in the '74-'75 year--changes which influenced the way we laughed, the way we cried, and the way we loved. These moods are extremely difficult to capture on paper or even in the form of a photograph, but most will agree that the 1975 LION has done it. There were times when we wondered if the LION would ever get to the presses, but all of the planning has paid off. The LION of 1975 is without question the greatest, most memorable book in the history of Grahm Jr. College.

Special thanks goes to our Advisor, Patricia M. Yantz who was instrumental in the publishing of the 1975 LION. Her expertise with the English Language was of great help, as was her tolerance of our creative habits.

Here then are the faces, places and memories. We used the TIME Magazine format to convey not only the big news events at Grahm, but also the flavor and quality of the years we have spent here. With our education, perhaps we can put our problems into better perspective and tackle them accordingly.

LACY ALSTON... of Washington, D.C. plans to get into the Management Field. His major while at Grahm was Business Management.

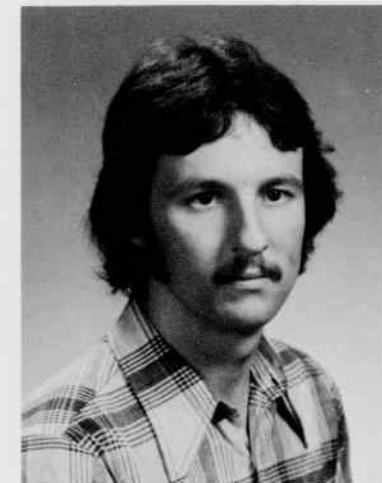

JEANNIE EUFRAZIO... is of North Plymouth, MA. A legal secretarial major while at GJC, she was also one of the many commuters who attended Gramh.

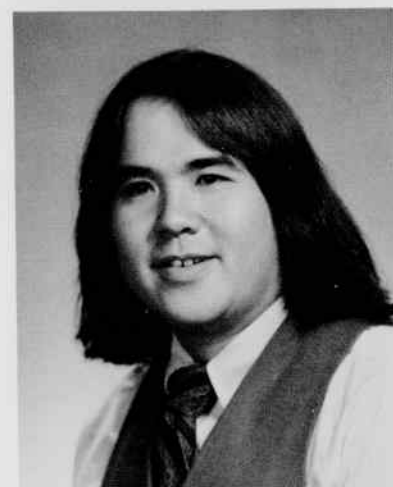


FREDERICK EVANS... A Kenmore Hall resident, Ted also was a Radio Broadcast major. While not at Gramh, he lives in Villanova.
